Donating Life Insurance to the Peace Endowment Fund

There are a number of ways you can use life insurance to make a donation to the Peace Endowment Fund.

- Consider transferring the ownership of an existing life insurance contract to the endowment fund.
- Purchase a new life insurance contract and name the endowment fund as the owner and beneficiary.
- Designate the endowment fund as the beneficiary of a life insurance contract you continue to own.

Life insurance can be a special vehicle for giving to the endowment fund. If ownership is transferred to the endowment fund and the endowment fund is the beneficiary, the premium payments may even be tax-deductible—regardless of your age or the size of your estate.
