Someone once told me that it is ok to change your mind in light of new facts. I used to think that. Joking aside, I still think that. As human beings, we are fallible, and we know that we don't know everything. God's world is much bigger and more complicated than our little minds can comprehend. So, we must always be ready to humbly accept that we have made mistakes and learn to think differently.

This month we begin Lent. It is the season of the church year leading up to Jesus' death on the cross. Traditionally, it has been a season of fasting and repentance. In the New Testament, the word "repent" translates a Greek word, "metanoia". That word is a combination of the words for "change" (meta) and "mind" (noia). While looking at word origins can sometimes lead translators astray, in this case, I think it is helpful.

Repentance is the changing of one's mind. When we sin, we are thinking, feeling, and acting in ways that are not aligned with God's good and perfect will. When we repent, we stop thinking our own way and start thinking God's way.

An example might be helpful. When I was younger, I, like many young men, used to like to get drunk. I would hang out with my buddies and drink until my tongue was loose, my face was numb, and my already poor judgment became reckless folly. I didn't think of it as sin until one day when I was drunk enough to be stupid but not so drunk, I would not remember my stupidity. I remember waking up the next day and thinking back to the night before. I was embarrassed by my selfishness. I can be selfish when I am sober, but in this case, I was extra selfish. I thought, "That is not the person that Jesus wants me to be." So, with that new thought, I turned back to Jesus, and he changed the way I approach drinking. I still like to have a couple of beers but no longer do I seek sodden stupidity. That is repentance. God changes the way we think, and it results in a new way of living. Now, honestly, I cannot remember if I ever got stupidly drunk after

that night or not. I know that if I did, God's grace was there to forgive me and to continue to move me to a new way of thinking and living around alcohol. Repentance doesn't mean that we will never slip up again, but it does mean that we are starting to think a new way-God's way.

So, this Lent, let's open our ears to God's Word so He can change our minds to think His way!
