So, as we enter 2022, I do not propose a plan or a goal for us as a community of Jesus followers. Instead, Lordwilling, I want to encourage us to enter the new year with an emphasis on listening. An old Jewish proverb says that God gave us two ears and only one mouth because we are designed to listen way more than we are to talk. Listening is an act of love. In St. Francis' peace prayer, he asks that God grant that we do not so much seek to be understood as to understand. God's Word encourages us to be quick to listen and slow to speak. (James 1:19) I wonder what would happen if we, by God's grace, truly became a community of people that truly listened to God, to each other and to the world that surrounds us.

We will also be working on listening to each other and to the community around us through an emphasis we call, "Speak Freely. We Listen." The leadership team will be choosing questions for us to ask each other and people in the community. We will be training volunteers to listen so that we can truly understand what others are thinking. The goal is simply to understand the world into which God has placed us. We want to love our neighbors by listening to them. Then, hopefully, as we understand the way our neighbors think and their perceived needs, we can learn how best to reach out with Jesus' love.

I hope that you will commit to joining me as we enter this new year with all of the unknowns that are before us. Let's trust God and work together to learn to listen deeply to God, to each other, and to the world.


# Leadership Team Highlights

#### Women's Ministries


