

## Standing Confidently in the Promises of God *by Pastor Todd Roeske*

The Israelites had been wondering for 40 years. Now Moses was dead and Joshua stood with them on edge of the Promised Land. The nation had survived the wilderness, but now they were looking out over a flooded Jordan River that seemed like an impossible barrier to their entering the new world that God had promised them.

So, God told Joshua to tell the Priests carrying the Ark of God's Promises to step right into the Jordan River and stand there. This must have seemed silly. The river was flooded and they were supposed to go wading. As soon as they did, something happened. The

water stopped. Unfortunately, it did not stop in front of the priests. It stopped 12 miles upstream. That means for 3 or 4 hours the water continued to flow over the priest's feet before it finally abated.

I can imagine the priests standing in the water thinking, "Joshua, this isn't working. My toes are getting wrinkly from standing in this water and the water is still flowing." God had already solved their problem. God had already damned the river but the Israelites didn't know that he had done it. They had to stand in faith and wait to see what God had done.


# Little Doves

## Preschool and Kindergarten

### School Reopening

We reopened the school mid-October after closing last March.

After much preparation to meet recommended guidelines for meeting during the pandemic, we opened with three classes and 1/3 of our normal enrollment of students.



### School Safety Measures

We have kept the classes smaller to maintain proper social distancing. We are careful not to mix the “pods” of students. We have instituted a contactless check-in. Visitors are not allowed inside the building. Temperatures are checked. We do not share snacks. All classrooms have air filters. Portable sinks are outside and in the classrooms. Everyone wears a mask. We have lots of hand washing and an abundance of disinfectant cleaning.

### God's Guidance and Care

We are thankful and grateful for God's protection, guidance, and care through these unprecedented times. So far we have had no COVID -19 outbreaks where we would have had to close the school.

Please keep us in your prayers as we continue to support our children and their families.

Watch for information regarding enrollment for next year! Registration starts in February.


