In Africa, the people in the congregation dance forward and drop their offerings in the plate. In the Philippines, people walk forward and drop them in a basket. When I grew up, two ushers passed brass offering plates through the congregation collecting the offerings of God's people. In Jesus' time, there was a box at the back of the temple where the faithful would drop their offerings to God. Now, many people donate online or through text.

A couple of people have asked me why we don't go back to passing the plate like we used to before COVID. Some people think that we might even get more offerings if people saw a plate being passed in front of them. It feels a little awkward to have a plate passed in front of you if you don't put anything into it.

I think the answer has to do with why we have an offering in the first place. God does not need our money. The bible says, "every animal of the forest is mine, the cattle on a thousand hills. I know every bird of the mountains, and the creatures of the field are mine. If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for the world and everything in it is mine." (Psalm 50:10-12) We do not give offerings because God needs our money. All that exists belongs to God. Instead, we give offerings as a sign of our thankfulness, love, and trust. We give offerings to show that we know that all that we have is not really ours. Offerings remind us that God has provided for us all that we need.

So when God's people give offerings at church, the point is not to see how much money the



But you might say, "Wait a minute. The church is struggling financially. Our offerings do not cover our expenses. Don't we need to have more offerings to cover our needs?" In one sense, that is true. God condescends to let us be a part of supporting the work of his mission. He gives us the privilege of helping the poor, supporting our pastor, and even paying the utilities at the church. If God's people are not faithful, God may let the congregation struggle to teach us to be faithful with the gifts that he has given us or to teach us to pray to him to supply our needs. However, it is still not about the money. The money is a means to express our faithfulness or to lead us to prayer.

Back to how we collect the offering. Passing the plate was a convenience so that Jesus' followers could easily give their offerings. However, passing the plate is awkward for visitors who don't understand what Christian offerings are about. Some may even put in an offering out of obligation. Those gifts are spiritually harmful. The only reasons to give to God are faith and gratitude. We don't want people to give for any other reasons. Our box in the back of the sanctuary is a reminder that our offerings are a deliberate act of love. We give because God has given to us. We give generously because we know that no matter

how much we give, God continues to supply all our needs. We give joyfully because we know that God multiplies our gifts and uses them to extend his kingdom.

May God's generous grace fill you with generous joy as you follow Jesus each and every day!
