Then Joseph had another dream and had to take a long journey with his new wife and child to Egypt. It was quite the few months for Joseph. He would remember this for his whole life. But when he finally got home, he went to work as a carpenter. Day after day, there was nothing incredible. He taught his son, Jesus, how to make things. Then Joseph just vanishes from the Bible's record. Scholars guess that he died. There is no record of a funeral or anything. Joseph played his part and then it was over.


