ZION SCHOOL REPORT

Weighing in at 207 pages, the combined reports of seven different accreditation subcommittees came before the **Accreditation Steering** Committee during an 11 January Zoom meeting. The meeting focused primarily on grade inflation (unrealistically high ratings for different areas such as curriculum, facilities, counseling etc.), and preparing the action plan. The accreditation visitation team will spend the last few days in March visiting the campus.

February 6-12 Psalm 1


