We tend to overcomplicate things. I could have just said, "Will the last one to leave, please turn out the lights." It is tempting to overcomplicate our Christian faith, as well.

Certainly, the Bible is complicated. There are a host of stories from an ancient culture that one can spend a lifetime exploring, digging out the deeper meaning, and connecting the themes. Millions of theological books and doctoral theses have been written exploring those. And yet all that complexity can be boiled down to a very simple message. God loved the world in this way, he sent

his one and only Son that whoever believes in him will not perish but have everlasting life (John 3:16). Since God loves us like this, we now love him and love other people (1 John 4:10-11). That is pretty straight forward.

And yet, it takes us a lifetime to figure out what that means and how to really live out those simple truths. How do we love and trust in God above all things? How do we love our fellow brothers and sisters at church? How do we love those with whom we work or go to school? How do we love those who struggle with their identity? How do we love those who have no homes? How do we love those who understand the world differently than we do? How do we love our enemies? How can we have enemies if we love those we thought were our enemies? And so on...



I pray this finds you looking forward to a wonderful new year as you continue your walk with God. My own walk has included not only worship, study, and prayer, but also feet-on-the-pavement walks. For 869 consecutive days (and counting!), I've disconnected from my phone, my computer, and my TV and walked.

My walks started with a miserable slog around the block. After a wonderful time away with family, I'd stepped on the scale and looked down in horror: eight pounds! *Eight pounds?!* Stepping away and looking in the mirror, I ripped into my reflection. *Really, eight pounds? You're away on vacation eight days and you're up eight pounds?!?* 

I looked down at the scale in disgust, trying hard to remember a great time away while staring at my pronounced flaws. I stepped away and stood in front of the mirror. My body shuddered; my shoulders slumped. My spirits low, my heart heavy, I stepped outside and began that miserable twenty-minute slog around the block.

On a beautiful summer morning, my feet balked with every step. The fresh air stung my cheeks. I barely looked ahead, afraid that every passing car, every neighbor would surely recognize my shame. That morning I could not have imagined my time outside would be the first of 869 walks. That such an accomplishment could come from such disappointment and frustration stuns me. That God could use a little fresh air to lead and direct me is overwhelming.

After vacation, I looked in the mirror and saw nothing but flaws, disappointment and frustration. God saw someone who'd fallen short in many, many ways, but who was about to reconnect with herself, but more importantly, with Him. I saw defeat. God saw promise. I saw wrong turns made, stumbles taken, missteps. God saw opportunities.

Post-Covid it's easy to "look in the mirror" as a church. It's easy to focus on our pronounced flaws. We can find our spirits sinking, our hearts getting heavy. Attendance is down. Giving is down. Special people are no longer with us. Some have moved away; some have passed away. So much isn't as it was.

That's what we see. God sees opportunities to reconnect with each other and with Him. God sees promise and possibilities as we reach out to His people. God sees opportunities for us to be a light in dark places.

Looking back, I smile at the woman whose frustration and disappointment found her fleeing the scale and stumbling out the door for a walk around the block. What started as an escape from a seemingly impossible situation became an opportunity to take my faith to a deeper, more personal level.

I smile, knowing He's here for us as His church, too!
